

LIGHTING OF THE FIRST ADVENT CANDLE

One: I will wait for coffee to brew. Two: I will wait for traffic to clear. One: I will wait for fruit to ripen.

Two: I will wait for flowers to grow. *One: I will wait for seasons to change.*Two: I will wait for the sun to rise. *One: I will wait for you to say sorry.*

The plants are on order to grace the Meetinghouse during the Christmas season.



Text to Give

If you haven't tried it out, it's easy:

- Text 866-586-0169 (the give-by-text number for West Parish) and in the body of the message enter the amount you wish to donate and send.
