



INVITATION

The psalmist sang, "You prepare a table for me in the presence of my enemies." This is not a taunting meal with Usses and Thems. It's a place, a time when even enemies can feast together. Come, then, you who have harsh words between you. Stand side by side in silence. Come, you who have fought good fights and bad fights and everything in between. Find peace, if only for a moment. Come, you

who can't find the face of God in every sibling. God abhors abuse, and never asks us to submit to the domineering strength of one another. But true reconciliation among people on equal footing sets us free and transforms conflict into amazing grace. So lay aside argument, distance, alienation, confusion, power over, and even principles. Come to this feast empty, hungry and ready.



PRAYER OF COMMUNION

Holy One, you inhabit these elements of bread and cup. As each has been transformed from what it was into something more nourishing, ready to give energy to the body, so transform us into those who can nourish the world. As we pull from a common loaf, unite us. As we dip into a common cup, a symbol of shared fate, send us down the same road, with strength in numbers. Make us truly one in Christ.

DISTRIBUTION OF THE ELEMENTS

We remember that on the night before he died, Jesus sat at a table with all of them: friend and foe. He didn't ask how they had voted, where they stood on church doctrines, or whether they would remain true, even to him. He took the bread, and giving thanks to God, he said to all, "Take, eat, this is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." He took wine and said, "This is not just a cup, it's a covenant, to bind us together, to help us forget the sins of the past. Take, drink, in remembrance of me." Ministering to you in Jesus' name, the Great Uniter, we give you this bread and this cup.

UNISON PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

God, let the unity we have at this table endure long after we have digested these elements. Feed our minds the manna of gentleness and the ability to take another's perspective. Juice us with the joy that comes when we can set aside our differences and come together as your children. Thank you that every time we eat this meal together, you give us an opportunity to lay down arms, stop taking sides, and find our common humanity and divinity. Amen.
