

THE BREAD OF LIFE AND THE CUP OF NEW BEGINNINGS ARE SHARED Our service of communion is open to all seeking Christ's presence. Whether children receive the elements we leave to their parents' discretion. We shall be receiving communion by the ancient practice of intinction. Come forward, take a piece of the bread, dip it in the cup, and consume it on the way back to your seat. We offer a communion cup and wafer system of cranberry juice and cracker.

INVITATION

When Christians talk about Communion, we say it's a remembrance of Jesus, a memorial. Which is true, but also, potentially misleading, as if what we're doing at the table is reminiscing, like you would at a wake.

But in the Gospel's original Greek, the word for remembrance is stronger, edgier, more demanding—*anamnesis*—literally, "against amnesia." It turns out that remembering Jesus in Communion is oppositional, like standing up to something, like standing against an adversary. Remembering at the table is not reminiscence; it's resistance. It's refusing to forget.

Communion is a dangerous memory: it's our uprising. At the table we take a stand. We remember him. We remember each other. We remember everyone and everything hate wants to erase. We refuse to forget.



PRAYER OF COMMUNION

As we share this meal, help us rejoice that Christ is present with us here. Give us love for one another and make us servants of peace until your new age of justice comes and every creature beholds it.

DISTRIBUTION OF THE ELEMENTS

On the night before he was betrayed, Jesus got up from the table. He bent before his friends like a servant, and washed their feet, saying, "Unless you let me do this for you, you can have no part of me."



He also took bread, blessed it, divided it, and handed it to them, saying, "Take, drink, this is my lifeblood, poured out for you. As often as you eat this bread and drink this cup you celebrate my lifework until it is complete."

Ministering to you in the name of Jesus, you are welcome to taste and see the goodness of God.
