#### WHAT IS THE UCC?

The United Church of Christ (UCC) is us. In 1957, the Congregational Christian Churches (dating from the Pilgrims) and the Evangelical and Reformed Church (originating in Germany) merged to form the United Church of Christ.

Each congregation is autonomous. We decide who will be our pastor, how we will worship, and whom we will welcome. But, just as you can't be a Christian without a neighbor, so a congregation can't be a church if it isn't related by covenant with other congregations. The United Church of Christ is West Parish linked to other churches – of the UCC in other parts of the country, in other nations of the world, and in other faith traditions.

Through the UCC, we have access to resources which enrich us and help us in many ways: curricula for the church school, programs to help us with church finances and stewardship, a pastoral excellence program which helps our pastor be the best he can be for us, staff that help churches when they are searching for a new pastor or struggling over internal issues, etc.

But we also, through the UCC, have access to different ways to reach out and help the world, whether it be through connections with other UCC churches, or through mission efforts that are too large for any one church to take on by themselves.

#### YOUR OUTREACH, WHO YOU SUPPORT

Thanks to your giving, we support many organizations locally, nationally, and globally, who do good – Jesus tells us to love our neighbor, and this is just one way you do that!

This month we highlight **Meetinghouse Farm** - the mission of Meetinghouse Farm is to foster horticultural and agricultural values and practices in the community, and is located right down the road here on Rt. 149.

Due to the generous donations from the congregation, the Outreach Board has donated an additional \$500 additional to the Neighbors Fund of Cape Cod (formerly the Needy Fund) for the Christmas season.

We also gave Salvation Army \$500 in the form of gift cards for children, in addition to dressing a live doll with gifts of flowers, clothing, and accessories. Thank you

### 2024 ROOSTER CROW'S FAIR Another great success!!



Thanks to the hard work and energy of so many of our church members, the 2024 Rooster Crow's Fair raised the second largest amount in our history. This year, total sales were \$14,706.00 and the Sponsorships totaled \$14,618.00 from 43 donors for a grand total of \$29,324.00 which doesn't include over \$2,000 raised by the Family School. This is \$1,132 more than the \$28,192 raised last year.

In spite of rainy and cold weather, we still welcomed a steady stream of patrons who came to sample the baked goods, Christmas decorations and crafts, fudge, jewelry, wood turnings, knitting, and mercantile. Earl Maryatt played Christmas music on the piano in the morning and Paula King played the organ in the afternoon helping to create an even more festive atmosphere.

While the fair is an important fundraiser for the church, it also serves as an important way for us to connect with the broader community showcasing our historic Meetinghouse as well as the many committed folks who show their talents and support for West Parish. Thanks to Everyone!!
