


Easter Sunday meant dressing really fancy for church?




Moving ahead while honoring tradition

We started March with Read Across America and had guest readers in the classrooms for the first week of the month with a special visit from local author Jessica Bourkas who read from her new book "Whatever is Lovely".







Pastor Christie shared a book from her childhood, "My Book About Me" a Dr. Seuss book that the reader can write in (gasp!). Copies were given to the Pre-K classes, so the students could write in their own book.



In our continuing program students interacting with seniors, Miss Chrissy coordinated a group from Harbor Point in Centerville to come and make St. Patrick's Day themed crafts. The surprise ... Miss Chrissy's grandmother came along!

## YOUR OUTREACH, WHO YOU SUPPORT


Thanks to your giving, we support many organizations locally, nationally, and globally, who do good – Jesus tells us to love our neighbor, and this is just one way you do that!
