

INVITATION

On the day of his resurrection, Jesus appeared to two disciples on the road to Emmaus, but they did not recognize him. Later while he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him. May Christ's presence be made known to us in the breaking of the bread.



PRAYER OF COMMUNION

Blessed are you, gracious God, Creator of light, Giver of all life, Source of love. Your song of wisdom rang out before the world began; your ancient love still touches us and stirs within us. Even when we turn away from you, you keep faith in us. You send your messenger to prepare the way through the wilderness of our living, to guide us in the path of wholeness, to call us to repent. In Mary, a woman of your promise, you showed us courage and faith; in the fullness of time, you sent us your greatest gift, Jesus, the Christ, our prince of peace and herald of hope. So it is that we join the Advent prayer of all your people, "O come, Emmanuel." And as we wait and watch for your coming, we proclaim your goodness. Amen.

DISTRIBUTION OF THE ELEMENTS

(We offer a covid-safe communion cup and wafer system of grape juice and cracker.)

We gather at this table to remember that on the night before he died, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it, he broke it, and gave it to those sitting around him, saying, "take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way after supper, he took the cup, saying: "This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood, shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."
